Oct. 17th, 1772.

At a meeting of the President & Masters of W^m & Mary College.

Present:

The Rev^d M^r John Camm, President, M^r Jones, M^r Johnson,
& M^r Gwatkin.

Resol: That the Society do agree to take a Bond of James Parke Farley, Esq^r for One hundred Pounds sterling in part of Col. Ben: Harrison's acc^t due to the College,—that the said Harrison must give Bond & Security for the Balance, & also pay the costs of the Suit that has been commenced against him for the said Account.

Resol: That Mess^{rs} Walker Maury, John Nelson, Burwell Starke, Emmanuel Jones, & William Yates be removed to the Philosophy Schools after Christmas.

January 29th, 1773.

Resol: That Mr James Wilson be appointed Gardiner of the College in the Room of Mr Ja^s Nicolson, deceas'd.

Resol: That a Salary of £50 Sterling P. Ann: be allowed the Gardiner in consideration of his performing the Offices of Janitor & Steward, and as a compensation for his not being allowed to sell any Seeds out of the Garden.

February 9th, 1773.

Resol: Unanimously, that Mess^{rs} Walker Murray & Emmanuel Jones be elected on two studentships.

Resol: Unanimously, that Mr William Yates be elected on a studentship vacant by the resignation of Mr John Leland.

February 26th, 1773.

At a meeting of the President & Masters of W^m & Mary College.

Present:

The Rev^d M^r Camm, President, M^r Jones, M^r Johnson, M^r Dixon, & M^r Gwatin.

Resol: That the Room on the South Side of the Library Door be set apart for an Infirmary, the Room formerly appointed being look'd upon as improper for that Purpose; that the Key be kept with the Housekeeper, and not to be deliver'd out, but upon particular Occasions.

Resol: That Mess^{rs} Stuart, Jones, and Yates have the Room on the North Side of the Library.

Resol: That Mes^{rs} Todd, Shields, and Burton have the Room on the South Side the old Dormitory Stair-Case.

Resol: That Mes^{rs} Tho^s John, and Rob^t Nelson, & Carter Burwell have the Room on the North Side the old Dormitory Stair-Case.

Resol: That Mes^{rs} Eggleston, Fontaine, White, and Clay have the Room at the Head of the New Dormitory Stair-Case.

Resol: That four Loads of Wood be sent to M^{rs} Wager, who has the care of some young Negroes belonging to the College.

Resol: That the Sum of Forty Shillings P. Ann: be added to the Stocking-mender's Salary.

Resol: That M^r Dixon be desir'd to reprimand M^r Todd for being absent from his Duty without Leave from the President, or any of the Professors.

Resol: That M^r Thomas Clay, formerly mention'd to be recommended to the Visters, be now appointed to a Notaway Foundation in the Room of M^r Walker Mauray, elected a Student.

Resol: That M^r William Dixon be appointed on a Notaway

Foundation in the Room of M^r William Yates, elected a Student.

Resol: That M^r John White be recommended to the Visters for a Foundation vacant by M^r Emmanuel Jones being elected a Student.

Resol: That M^r Langhorn Dade be recommended to the Visters for a Foundation in the Room of M^r Thomas Clay, now elected on a Notaway foundation.

Resol: That M^r W^m Smelt be recommended to the Visters for a foundation vacant by the resignation of M^r Ed: Yates.

Resol: That M^r David Stuart have leave to reside at M^r Wrays as long as the Society find no Inconvenience arise from it.

July 29th, 1773.

Agreed—That the Student who has obtain'd one of the Medals assign'd for the encouragement of Philosophical & Classical Learning be not allow'd to stand as a Candidate for the other.

Agreed—That the Medal assign'd for Philosophical Learning be given to M^r David Stewart.

Agreed—That the Medal assign'd for the Encouragement of classical Learning be given to M^r Samuel Shield.

Agreed unanimously—That M^r Thomas Jefferson be appointed Surveyor of Albemarle in the Room of M^r Nicholas Lewis, who has sent his Letter of Resignation, & that he be allow'd to have a Deputy.

Oct^r 19th, 1773.

At a meeting of the President & Masters of W^m & Mary College.

Present:

The Rev^d & Hon^{ble} John Camm, President, M^r Jones, M^r Dixon, M^r Gwatkin & M^r Madison.

M^r President represented to the Society that the Governor had received Information that M^r Thomas Bullett, who formerly appointed Surveyor of certain Lands on the Ohio, in this Colony, was giving much Disturbance to the Indians and others on the Frontiers: the Society being of Opinion that a Continuance of him in the said Office would be productive of ill Consequence, do order the Commission appointing him Surveyor as aforesaid be revoked & superseded.

A Revocation of the Commission formerly granted to Thomas Bullett being prepared agreeable to the Order of the Society, the same sign'd, seal'd & duly executed by the Society, and was directed to be sent away by the first convenient opportunity.

Agreed unanimously—That M^r George Braxton be appointed a Scholar on the Foundation left to the Society by the late Rev^d & Hon^{ble} M^r Commisary Blair.

Agreed unanimously—That M^r Thomas Evans be recommended to the Visitors for the Foundation vacant by the Resignation of M^r William Fontaine.

Jan^y 28th, 1774.

At a meeting of the President & Masters of W^m & Mary College.

Order'd—That the Rev: M^r Gwatkin be desir'd to write to M^r Clay's father, and give him a full account of his late behaviour, and in what manner he left the College; that the said Clay be readmitted to his Foundation, provided he submit to the Discipline requir'd, or be expell'd the College, & in the meantime that he be suspended.

Order'd — That M^r Christopher Todd's Studentship be declar'd vacant from 24th June last.

Order'd—That the Rev: M^r Gwatkin be desir'd to write to Charles Read's Guardian, and acquaint him that the said Reade will loose his Foundation unless he returns immediately.

Order'd—That Mes^{rs} John White & Nath: Nelson be elected Students.

Order'd—That a fire Engine be provided for the use of the College.

Order'd—That a Memorial be presented to His Excellency the Governour & Council in behalf of Capⁿ Tho^s Bullett.
